To maximise its impact, we will review and refine its focus - repositioning the Institute, strengthening training programs, and embedding research partnerships. This will ensure professionals have access to the most relevant, evidence-based tools to support children impacted by trauma. A renewed approach will allow us to expand our reach, enhance workforce capability, and create lasting change in how trauma-informed care is integrated across communities.



Ending youth homelessness remains our founding vision. We are committed to increasing access to stable, healing homes by expanding our housing portfolio and exploring innovative models that provide flexible solutions for young people in need, wherever they are, in the community.

2025-2028 STRATEGIC DIRECTION

Over the next three years, we will build on the significant impact we've made over the past 33 years, supporting over 1,336 children and young people. To continue this transformative work, we will strengthen our Foster Care and Family Support Program, with a growing focus on Kinship Care Support. At the same time, we will expand our efforts with Lighthouse Homes and In Community. This will be guided by four key priorities aimed at expanding our reach, enhancing our impact, and creating a future where every child has the opportunity to heal, thrive, and develop a lifelong sense of belonging.

By reviewing, refining, and expanding our core strategic initiatives, we will strengthen Lighthouse's long-term impact in breaking the cycle of intergenerational trauma.



Lighthouse's Foster Care and Family Support
Program prioritises kinship care as the preferred
option for children unable to live with their parents.
This approach provides stability, maintains family
connections, and helps break cycles of
intergenerational trauma. To maximise its impact,
we will refine and expand our approach to better
support kinship carers and the children in their care.

ACTION STEPS:

- Evaluate and enhance the Lighthouse Kinship Care model to improve outcomes for children and families
- Strengthen partnerships to expand support networks and increase access to services
- Continue to invest to scale the program's reach and impact
- Partner with Monash University to research and promote Lighthouse's effective kinship model to provide stability and connection for children in care.



EXPAND LIGHTHOUSE HOMES
TO PROVIDE STABILITY FOR
MORE YOUNG PEOPLE

Safe, stable housing is essential for breaking the cycle of youth homelessness. Lighthouse is committed to expanding its housing portfolio to ensure more young people have access to healing environments where they can thrive.

ACTION STEPS:

- Grow our housing footprint in high-demand areas, including identifying opportunities in regional Victoria
- Explore innovative housing models to increase accessibility and community support
- Strengthen partnerships to secure funding and land for future developments
- Operate homes within a financially sustainable framework.





DEVELOP LIGHTHOUSE'S INSTITUTE TO EXPAND TRAUMAINFORMED PRACTICES IN THE COMMUNITY

The intention is for the Lighthouse Institute to be a leading centre for trauma-informed workforce development. To meet growing demand, we will refresh the Institute, ensuring it delivers relevant, evidence-based training that empowers professionals working with traumatised children.

ACTION STEPS:

- Define a clear vision for the Institute's role in workforce development
- Prioritise data collection to build evidence-based approaches that improve support for children and young people
- Advocate for trauma-informed care to be integrated into mainstream education and community organisations
- Strengthen training programs and research partnerships to enhance knowledge and impact
- Develop training modules, cost structures, and strategic alliances to support long-term growth.



STRENGTHENING CORPORATE AND PHILANTHROPIC PARTNERSHIPS

The Lighthouse Foundation is dedicated to building sustainable partnerships with organisations, businesses, and philanthropic leaders who share our values and dedication to positively transforming the lives of young people.

ACTION STEPS:

- Embed Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) principles into our partnership strategy to ensure alignment with values-driven partners
- In response to program needs, develop funding strategies that provide long-term stability and scalability
- Investigate and leverage opportunities within annuity funding models to create long term financial stability and sustainability for our programs
- Explore new investment and land access opportunities to support future growth.
